Updates from the Neighborhood Watch: Herman Thio

The HP Neighborhood Watch recorded two incidents in the third quarter of 2023. The first incident occurred on Thu 8/17, a homeowner noticed a Hyundai Elantra parked on the side of Settlers Court between Livingstone Drive and Homestead. The driver's rear window was broken. Inside of the car, it appeared it had been ransacked. Cary Police were called. The car was dusted for prints and towed away. Grandchester Meadow sent out an Incident Alert to the Harrison Place homeowners about this incident along with a car theft in Homestead subdivision. A 2017 Lexus was stolen while parked in Homestead Drive in early September. The second incident occurred on Thu 9/21, several solar lights were stolen from the front yard by the mailbox on Livingstone Drive. Due to the cost of the stolen solar lights, Cary police were not called. Thank you to the homeowners who contacted and reported the incidents to our Neighborhood Watch block captains.
